

ROC Agenda 2010- ROC Meeting 10 Dec 2010

1. Who should teach the RO1 course? RO3 (instructor) or an RO2, with an RO3 present.
2. How to handle observed rule violations (off posse) that are not enforced by the TO. Politely bring it to the attention of the Posse Marshal, Range Master or Match Director.
3. Change Range Officer to TIMER OPERATOR- this will be cleaned up in the book where it applies.
4. Situation: Shooter is coached incorrectly by TO, and earns a procedural. The correct process would be to OFFER the shooter a reshoot (due to incorrect coaching), or the option of no reshoot and the current raw time score with a procedural would stand.
5. Add a line to item 1 – page 8 RO1 – Match Director in order to clarify that the Match Director has the final authority at the match: “...and the discretionary authority in extenuating circumstances.”
6. Reduce size of the current manuals / materials by removing redundant materials. Possible moving the Quick Reference penalty guide and miss flow chart to the SHB.
7. Boot soles in CC/BW edit to read “NO LUG SOLES”
8. Define what is an “OPEN ACTION” ROC is still working on this one.
9. Distance between Targets for “Clean Miss” Use common sense and judgment
10. Distance allowed from loading table with loaded guns. Use common sense and judgment.
11. Distance allowed from unloading table with un-cleared guns. Use common sense and judgment.
12. Revolver rear sight inserts / outlined sights. Verbiage for rifle to be inserted to keep consistency for revolvers: “Rear sights may utilize an insert of the same color as the rear sight to allow easy sight adjustment” added to “Adjustable sight revolver” on page 6 of RO1.
13. Define who may “OFFICALLY” coach the shooter. TO is the official coach. Spotters should assist the TO and coach for safety issues (closed lever, casing in action, round count, etc) and knockdown targets.
14. Are restarts shooter’s RIGHT or are they granted by the TO? TOs may authorize a restart. Shooter may request a restart, and the TO may allow it when requested. Final decision will always rest with the TO.
15. SxS Shotguns – Spring added to assist extractor, but does not eject hulls? NOT LEGAL!
16. Laramie revolver rear sight. Can they change to be considered “Fixed”? YES
17. Loading and Unloading Procedures are different from the Stage Description.

The stage description tells us how many rounds to load and how to shoot the stage, engagement sequences, etc.

Loading and unloading procedures are safety related like: “don’t leave the loading table with loaded guns other than to start the stage”; “don’t leave your hammer down on a live round/chamber”; don’t seat your caps with the hammer of your revolver”; unload your guns completely at the unloading table” etc, applying to every stage.

They are different, and these differences should be UNDERSTOOD!
